<u>Speaker for SEPT. 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014– Jack Simpson</u> (To Be Introduced By Dep. Cdr. Marilyn Pahr)
The 281<sup>st</sup> meeting of the *Atlanta WW II Round Table* will feature Jack Simpson as our speaker. Jack is a WW II combat veteran who fought with the 45<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division at Anzio Beach, Italy and later taking part in the invasion of Southern France and Germany. Simpson was part of a 105mm tracked howitzer crew.

The 45<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division along with other elements of the U.S. 5<sup>th</sup> swarmed ashore on a fifteen-mile stretch of Italian beach near the prewar resort towns of Anzio and Nettuno in January 1944. Commanded by General Troy Middleton and under the overall command of General John P. Lucas, the 45<sup>th</sup> got ashore under constant bombing, shelling and small-arms fire; walking and constantly digging foxholes as they advanced slowly forward while fighting alongside U.S. Ranger troops from the Third Division and some British forces.

At the time of the Anzio invasion, Simpson was just a boy from the Pennsylvania coalmines who found himself slap-inthe-middle of a war he didn't fully understand. From January – June 1944 the 45<sup>th</sup> had what Simpson called a 'tenuous' foothold on the beach at Anzio. He called is a place of pain, sorrow, death, destruction and eventually scattered crosses. The invasion of Anzio took a heavy toll on the Allies; Simpson saw many of the 7000 of his fellow soldiers left behind in the cemeteries of there. To those brave soldiers he had to leave behind, he would remember telling them to 'sleep-on' as he departed to carry on the fighting. He realized all those who sacrificed their lives helped keep the world safe for democracy.

Simpson became a FBI Special Agent after the war, serving the FBI for 23 years. He is a author and continues to work as a Deputy Sheriff and Bailiff in Rockdale and Newton Counties.

Top priority is given to the senior veterans - World War II survivors, along with those other veterans who may be terminally ill.

Dave reminded us that of all of the wars in recent memory, it was World War II that truly threatened our very existence as a nation—and as a culturally diverse, free society. According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, an estimated 640 WWII veterans die each day. Dave said the Honor Flight Organization honors these brave men CONTINUED ON BACK

and women and has long-range plans to continue the flights honoring Korean and Vietnam veterans.

"The desire for Rome, balked by successful German opposition in the intervening mountainous ground in southern Italy, led directly to the amphibious landing at Anzio. Even before the invasion of Italy, Allied leaders had recognized the difficulties of making swift overland advance in the troubled terrain south of Rome. Lacking numerically superior forces, constricted by the width of the Italian peninsula to a relatively short front, and limited by the mountains to well-defined corridors of advance, the Allied ground forces were restricted to frontal attack. Maneuver was possible only by means of sea-borne hooks-the Allies could envelop the enemy positions only by amphibious end runs."
